In the beginning, the university was opened in a rented building with a small number of faculties and administrators, where 250 male and female students were registered in three faculties, including Sharia and law, Education, and Arts and Humanities. Today - by the grace of God - the university has graduated thouands of students and established various well-equipped university campuses and a conducive educational environment for its students and workers,

pioneering in Somalia, a quality codified education

system, high in all areas necessary for reputable higher education. The university has also made great strides in establishing relations, where it became a member of higher education institutions. The Somali people have received the university well and given it their confidence after witnessing the high qualifications of its graduates, who have deservedly occupied thousands of high positions in public and private sectors at the national level

After massive sacrifices over the past 25 years, the university has become a role model and guiding light for the higher education institutions that were established after that and everyone interested in the field of higher education and scientific research in Somalia.

In conclusion, I take this opportunity to express my thanks and appreciation to everyone who contributed to building this lofty education model, including individuals and institutions, asking God Almighty to reward them, preserve this institution's position, and provide it with further progress and prosperity.

Introduction:

The University's mission has seven goals fundamental to national human resource development. The first one is to establish high-quality academic opportunities for Somali students in various fields of science and arts to meet the current national development needs. Similarly, producing Somali generations educated on the values of peace, good governance, community service, promoting conscious openness to the world, and integrating Islamic and social values in the work culture to achieve sustainable development in Somalia, is essential.

The goal of establishing the University was to break the chains of despair and frustration and to assist students who had completed secondary studies but could not continue because of the lack of higher education opportunities during the civil war. Also, the aim was to lead the journey of a model academic mission in the country.

The idea of establishing the University dates back to 1993; a group of professors from the National University of Somalia, along with others from international universities and some prominent figures in the society, gathered to establish a university in the country. Despite the difficult circumstances of despair and frustration in the country at the time. After intensive discussions in 1993, the participants

agreed on the need to form a committee to study the issue and embarked on the task of realizing this ambitious academic project.

On August 9, 1996, the committee presented its vision of the project, and after deep serious discussions, the participants decided to start implementing the project. The preparation of the curriculum, regulations and systems governing the functioning of the University were vital pillars to be initially erected. On September 22, 1997, Mogadishu University was formally initiated, and the Varsity began offering courses in three faculties (faculty of education, faculty of sharia' and law, and the faculty of Arts) - with five departments, as tabulated in the following table:

The University continuously improves and enhances its curriculum and overall education system, keeping in mind its obligation to educate its students, and that is to create an education system that parallels the 21st century.

Today, thousands of students are pursuing their studies in 11 faculties and 42 different specializations while graduates of the university work in public and private sectors all over Somalia, where MU graduates have received outstanding acceptance in the global business and employment markets. Some MU graduates have received Masters and Ph.D degrees from the University and elsewhere and are now participating and contributing

to the country's development. Based on the University's goals and objectives, initiatives were taken to allow students to pursue higher education and specialize in various spheres of science and Arts in response to the country's needs for educated and skilled human resources

Faculty of Health Sciences

Somalia has been suffering from the atrocities of the civil war since 1990 in which thousands of human lives were lost, properties destroyed and national institutions entirely leveled to the ground. During this prolonged civil war, an acute shortage of trained health workers was felt in all regions of the country. The UN agencies and some local and international NGOs had been trying to offer very limited health services and short training programs in their specific areas of interest. Thus establishing a health Institute in Somalia was not among their priorities. However, even

the establishment of this institute fell far short to cover the real needs for qualified Health professionals in Somalia. The Institute of Nursing was established in 2000 and after graduation of three batches; the institute was transformed into a Faculty of Health Sciences, offering Degrees at Bachelors level

Currently, the Faculty of Health Sciences consists of four departments:

- 1. General Nursing
- 2. Medical Laboratory Sciences (MLS)
- 3. Public Health
- 4. Nutrition and Dietetics
- 5. Midwifery
- 6. Micro-biology
- 7. Clinical Officer

Civil Engineering which offers five-year bachelor's degree consists of the following disciplines: Building Engineering, Environmental Engineering, Geotechnical Engineering, Transport Engineering and Water Resources Engineering. Faculty of Medicine & Surgery

Faculty of Medicine & Surgery was opened in 2013 to award a bachelor's degree of Medicine and Surgery to those who successfully complete a minimum of 381 required credit hours as set by the University statute. The undergraduate program of the Faculty of Medicine aims to qualify students to become doctors practicing their profession with the highest efficiency at home and abroad and able to continue their specialization in higher education and scientific research.

Duration of the program is six academic years, including one year of internship. The six (6) academic years are divided into:

- 1. Social and Humanistic Science Courses with medical emphasis.
- 2. Basic Science
- 3. Clinical Science
- 4. Field/Lab Instructions.
- Clinical Rotation Program
- Internship year divided into seven Modules (5 compulsory modules and 2 selective) rotations of 2 months each. Compulsory rotations are: general surgery, internal medicine, pediatrics, obstetrics and gynecology, emergency and anesthesia.

Graduates from the Faculty are intended to have remarkable careers in the healthcare sector. There are many opportunities for them to practice medicine in the

armed forces, local and regional aid agencies, hospitals, research institutions, private healthcare establishments, among others.

Faculty of Dentistry

Mogadishu University wants to meet the needs of oral health services in the country and beyond through a Bachelor of Dentistry program.

The dentistry faculty is committed to advancing dental knowledge as MU has incorporated leadership, management, and information technology in the course content. Much emphasis has been put on clinical and practical examination in the evaluation process.

The curriculum runs for five academic years, including a one-year training internship.

Graduates are expected to be disciplined and ethical dentists and well-versed with a holistic approach to dental care management.

Degree objectives

The following are the objectives of the faculty:

- To produce oral health professionals equipped with knowledge and skills in patient management.
- To instill in the student integrity and professionalism in the management of patients and interaction with professional peers.
- To equip the student with knowledge and critical thinking



Faculty of Veterinary science

The Bachelor of Veterinary Medicine is designed to address the country's growing needs for vets as most Somalis are pastoralists, and Somalia's economy heavily depends on livestock. This program is prepared to train personnel with the requisite knowledge and skills to work as veterinary surgeons, animal scientists, nutritionists, veterinary pharmacists, public health officers, and epidemiologists. This degree program responds to the emerging needs in

Somalia and the region by addressing animals in the Arid and Semi-Arid regions, emphasizing the acquisition of practical skills, including entrepreneurship. Ultimately, the students are expected to be equipped with the necessary knowledge and skills to meet public expectations.



Faculty of agricultural science

The Bachelor's degree in Agricultural Science has a rigorous and broad-based curriculum, which is designed to produce graduates who, through teaching, research, and consultancy, will provide technical services in agricultural business. agricultural policy formulation, animal production, crop and land management, environmental protection, and water resources.

Somalia enjoys large swathes of agricultural land, and its economy heavily depends on farming. Hence, the objective of the degree is to prepare competent graduates at the local and regional levels in agriculture and life sciences through adequate knowledge and skills in education and scientific research.

The program learners will take four academic years, each of which consists of two semesters.

Each student must undertake field practice, completing the coursework and other practical assignments that may apply to this degree.





Alumni Administration

Mogadishu University Alumni Administration is a connecting bridge between the University and its graduates to create cooperation in various aspects after graduation.

The Alumni program provide career guidance, personal development workshops, and other special privileges, which the admin sees it has more benefits for its members. Our notable alumni are now working in all public and private institutions within and outside the country.

Alumni Programs

The alumni are organized into Chapters based on their geographical locations to serve alumni living in a specific area by facilitating communication and nurturing their professional and social relations. Post-graduate Program

In addition to the undergraduate degree programs, MU offers a Post-graduate Program, which started as a partnership program with universities in Africa and Asia in January 2004. The first program was in collaboration with Omdurman University in Khartoum, Sudan, followed by the Open University of Malaysia and Asia e University in 2005. These programs were in the form of postgraduate diplomas, Master's and PhDs. Currently, such programs constitute various specializations.

As the number of graduates has increased over the years and the guest for research-based solutions in our society boosted, the need for postgraduate programs has become a pressing demand. Human Resource Development towards University Employees

Besides preparing students and producing educated and skilled human resources, the University offers its employees continuous development programs that include academic and administrative courses. The objective is to maintain their life-long learning status to develop their personal and professional skills and knowledge.

The goal is to facilitate University growth through capacity building of individual employees and improve the professional competence of academic and administrative staff. Every year, the University provides its employees with several academic and administrative opportunities by participating in seminars, workshops, conferences, and training courses inside and outside the country.

Moreover, the University has a policy of regular in-service training programs to improve the skills of its support staff. Such programs include short in-house seminars and workshops and practical on-the-job training. The aim is to encourage and empower them through education and skills.

AN OVERVIEW OF **UNIVERSITY'S TECHNOLOGY** FROM ITS INCEPTION **PRESENT**

During the civil war, conditions in the country did not allow appropriate technology. Nevertheless, the university staff was not only thinking about using appropriate technology; they were thinking of actively contributing to technology transfer to become self-sufficient in technical know-how. For that purpose, the university did what most people saw as impossible.

In 2003, the Faculty of Computer Science and Information Technology was founded and equipped with a modern laboratory that was rarely found in academic institutions in Somalia. It was the first of its kind in the country and an exceptional event. Because of the distant vision of the university administrators, the university has made a deliberate move toward modern technology until it became a national trend to use modern program applications.

Department of Admissions and Registration

The Department of Admissions and Registration is the first point of contact for students applying for the University, as it registers and accepts prospective university students using specific procedures. Other duties of the office include:

- Saving student documents and files,
- Ensuring that the student is eligible for promotion to the subsequent semesters, and

• Organizing re-study and re-exam subjects for certain students.

The Department used to do all its records manually by using paper records. However, in 2001 it began to use Microsoft office applications, such as (MS- Access & MS Excel), until 2014. In that year, there was a radical, rapid transformation of the Department, which utilized modern academic software applications dedicated to the management of educational institutions named (FEDENA), an online program directly connected to the parent company (Farodian). The university administration held intensive training courses for its staff to best use the new advanced application.

University library

The library of the university witnessed a remarkable development at the beginning of 2016. It adopted the FEDENA program to manage its affairs and left behind the paper-based records used in the past.

- The program offers all facilities necessary to manage the library effectively, such as recording books, magazines, and periodicals, managing book borrowing, and returning to the library, plus other functions.
- The University is currently seeking to develop the e-library section by signing agreements with international e-libraries to provide student online library services, using user names and passwords.



Human resource office

The FEDENA program facilitated Human Resources Management system effectively. It also provided new special sections like employee Leave and holiday management.

After adopting the FEDENA program in 2014, the office of the President can immediately obtain updated employee reports for use in the development and printing of its periodic publications and reports submitted to senior management to make sound decisions based on available data.

The University Website - www.mu.edu.so

The University's website is the leading portal for communications with the outside world. Therefore, the site received significant attention from the university administration and has become part of some of the top 50 African universities, according to the international university website evaluation reports.

The first website of the University was designed in 1999 when the internet was hardly available in Somalia due to the institutional collapse following the civil war. Hence, the University placed its information files on its website in three languages: Somali, Arabic, and English.

In 2013, the university administration decided to develop a competitive website that is comparable with sites of international universities in terms of its structure and content of its pages, that provides all the information a visitor wishes to obtain from the University, including daily university news, journals and scientific publications.

Developing Scientific Research

"Knowledge generated by research is the basis of sustainable development, which requires that knowledge be placed at the service of development, be converted into applications, and be shared to ensure widespread benefits," says Mary-Louise Kearney, Director of the UNESCO Forum on Higher Education, Research and Knowledge. Most universities highlight research as one of their most distinguished and competitive strengths. Ultimately, scientific research is also essential to our globalized society's economic and social development. Accordingly, Mogadishu University has established scientific research as follows:

1. Establishing MU Research Unit to conduct research programs, train and encourage researchers, supervise research students working towards their theses and dissertations, and publish a refereed academic journal in various fields of knowledge. The idea is to inspire a culture of research and positive competition among students, as well as publishing Bulletins of activities and institutional events. MU Research Unit issues an annual scientific refereed journal.

2. Institute for Somali Studies (ISOS)

The institute, founded in 2003, conducts academic studies, research, seminars, and workshops and offers courses on Somalia-related issues, ISOS issues a peer-reviewed academic journal for Somali studies and organizes the annual Somali Studies Conference. ISOS is a platform for sharing knowledge, ideas, and experience and promotes analysis of key contemporary issues and developments. It focuses on issues critical to the recovery and rebuilding of Somalia, a country recovering from a devastating civil war.

3. Institute of Peace and Environment: During the Somali civil war, water and the environment became a casualty of indiscriminate destruction due to the Somali civil conflict. For this reason, the Somali Center for Water and Environment was established in 2005 in Mogadishu to carry out surveys, research programs, and policy advocacy to explore and delineate the current state of the Somali water and environment. identify problems and propose solutions. In 2022, after 17 years of operation in Somalia, the SCWE has been upgraded into the Institute of Peace and environment. The institute employs environmental approaches like water harvesting, ecosystem

restoration, and reforestation to establish peace in the country.

4. MU Postgraduate program and Research aims to foster intellectual development, provide professional specialization, contribute to the development of research projects, and solve socio-political and economic problems, among other things.

The program includes joint studies between the University and partner universities that offer graduate programs, such as graduate Diplomas, Master's, and PhDs, with the following goals:

- 1. Cooperation with international universities through bilateral or multilateral relations and joint research initiatives
- 2. Standardization of knowledge and facilitation of technology transfer through the exchange of students and professors.
- 3. Promotion of the faculty members who have received different higher degrees, such as Master's and PhDs, plus others who have achieved such academic titles as associate, assistant, and full professorship.

- 4. Providing technical facilities to engineering and medical science faculties, such as laboratories, the latest specialized computers, and an E-library network
- 5. Organizing intellective seminars, workshops, symposiums, and debates for lecturers and students to deepen their learning and enhance their intellectual and research abilities

Community Continuing Education Programs

Community continuing education programs, also known as community-based education or community learning and development, are programs designed to promote learning and social development using a range of formal and informal methods; To achieve this objective, MU launched the following programs: •Adult education: MU engaged adult education in a systematic manner that provided methods of building knowledge, skills, attitudes, and values. The main objectives of such programs include enhancing student's potential and enabling them to face their future with confidence, applying critical thinking and reasoning skills to identify problems, and developing problem-solving abilities.

- Career Training Program: The Career Training Program (CTP) is a priority community education program that fosters better communication skills between individuals and organizations to assist their career decision-making ability. In organizations, communication skills provide them with better use of employee management.
- Youth programs: MU has implemented programs designed to target young students between 19 and 30. These programs are designed to enhance the lives of young people in terms of their relationships with their families, schools, communities, and peer groups. The aim is to empower youth in school performance and motivate them to resist violence and substance abuse.
- Teacher Training Programs are one of the longrunning ambitious projects to prepare teachers in both pre-and in-service categories. Many cohorts have graduated from the program so far, in collaboration with many regional and international organizations, which contributed to the success of this program.
- Currently employed in both public and private sectors, some of which hold key leadership positions in the country.

Student Training Programs

Based on the University's objective to equip students with higher skills contributing to the production of qualified graduate human resources with intellectual and spiritual energies, the University directs students positively toward the development of themselves, their society, their nation, and the world around them

Since its establishment, Mogadishu University - through the supervision of the students' affairs department - has been keen on enhancing the student's skills by conducting professional workshops, providing technical courses, and facilitating student activities in coordination with faculties and departments. These programs play a significant role in the university environment contributing to the formation of an independent, conscious, and responsible personality that promotes the spirit of teamwork and volunteerism to create a favorable environment among the members of the university family.

There are various ways to achieve these noble goals, such as the facilitation of public lectures, scientific seminars, training courses, discussion and roundtable debate circles, presentation of research results, open meetings with distinguished leaders and competent experts, as well as student exhibitions exploring students. Intellectual academic and innovative talents.

Field trainings:

The University and many other institutions collaborate to train students for various fields of specialization. These institutions include private sector institutions like hospitals, schools, telecommunication companies, and other business establishments to train students in a natural work environment under the joint supervision of the university faculties and cooperating partners. It is noteworthy that these training programs are mandatory requirements in some faculties reflecting the students' overall credit hours and grade point averages.

2. Student Camping:

Summer student camps and cultural and professional activities are considered the most crucial student activities at the university level as the University organizes such programs at the end of each academic year.





3. Volunteering in community service:

Distinguished in its educational/cultural plan, the University has established a pool of Volunteer hours for students to participate in social service activities by choosing the activities suitable to their abilities and talents.

These volunteering hours serve a vital aim by engaging students to voluntarily perform their duties towards the community in different areas during their university studies as each student contributes to specific mandatory areas.

4. Scientific seminars:

The university faculties and centers hold seminars in which research papers in various academic fields are presented, discussed, and analyzed to promote human and national values by deepening students' knowledge in his/her cognitive and social environment.

5. Cultural Week:

The Deanship of student affairs at the University organizes the cultural week at the beginning of the academic year to welcome the new students. The cultural week represents a significant opportunity for new students to learn about the University's community, its faculties, departments, regulations, public facilities, and ways of preserving them. In addition, the cultural week provides students with educational and cultural programs aimed at facilitating their future academic journey, and providing them with new opportunities to present their literary, artistic skills, and cultural talents, which helps their future career and professional development.

6. Student union:

The University student union was established to support and advocate for all students at the University and across all campuses.

Umus plays a significant role in providing educational and life services to students.

As studying at a university is not just about getting a degree, the union aims to help students make social connections, learn new skills, explore new cultures, and make all students feel like they are part of a community.

7. Preparatory programs for the labour market:

As the students are the backbone of the University, the Deanship of Student Affairs recognized the importance of caring for students and qualifying them for the labor market by adopting various training programs designed to prepare them for professional life and provide them with the necessary and modern skills. The Deanship has designed a series of courses, such as:

- Negotiation and persuasion skills,
- Orientation and induction programs for the new employees,
- Self-development programs and self-learning methods,
- Programs for academic excellence,
- Programs for computer applications,
- Programs for Entrepreneurship and Small business Projects.
- Public programs.



Preservation of National Culture and Heritage

According to the sixth goal of the University's mission, it is crucial to preserve the national cultural heritage with conscious openness to other cultures and educate young generations through cultural and creative pedagogy. Hence the University views heritage in a comprehensive perspective that accommodates Islamic, national, regional, and international inclusiveness.

Consequently, the University designed a set of courses taught in its overall academic programs that consolidate these cultural and identity-related principles with particular subjects that contribute in one way or another to protecting and enriching the national and cultural heritage.

The University's cultural preservation is not only limited to the academic aspect despite its importance. It took another direction to show the University's interest in heritage by establishing the Institute of Somali Studies early.

Institute for Somali Studies (ISOS) is a research Centre within Mogadishu University. The Institute aims at knowledge generation through research and analysis on Somalia, the Horn of Africa, and the Somali communities abroad. The Institute conducts and coordinates research, workshops, conferences, discussions, and dialogues; and disseminates findings, reports, and analysis through publications and events.

ISOS is a platform for sharing knowledge, ideas, and experience and promotes analysis of key contemporary issues and developments. It focuses on issues critical to the recovery and rebuilding of Somalia, a country recovering from a devastating civil war

International and Regional Cooperation

Based on the seventh goal of the university mission, it's imperative to cooperate with other like-minded institutions. Hence, fostering cooperation with international institutions is one of the university's strategic goals. For this reason, Mogadishu University is committed to establishing reciprocal cooperation with universities and other higher education organizations. In line with its mission: "to instill hope in the Somali society impaired by the protracted civil war, political instability, and the collapse of the state institutions," MU has established bilateral and multilateral cooperation with local, regional, and international organizations and associations across the world.

In support of its objectives of building strong cooperation with regional and international institutions, Mogadishu University has established a department of relations to foster local, national, and international cooperation and partnerships to enhance the university's image and reputation, and global standing. The mandate of this Department is to plan, organize, and carry out local and international relations and manage partnership projects. It also supports and coordinates with all other offices, centers, institutes, and faculties of the university in developing and sustaining wide-ranging forms of cooperation. In addition, MU opened a liaison office in Kenya's capital, Nairobi, to facilitate a closer working relationship between the university and regional and international organizations based in Nairobi.

MU has also partnered with international universities like Fort Hare University in South Africa and Kansas University in the USA to offer distance learning programs, including research methods in political science, a diploma in financial planning, CISCO network, and other academic programs. In addition, these programs offered courses in conflict studies, international relations, public administration, and politics, to name just a few.

Cooperation with other organizations

Mogadishu University has strengthened its relations with national, regional, and international organizations. Some of these which the university partnered with include the Islamic Development Bank, HIRDA Netherlands, United Nations Development Program (UNDP), Norway Refugee Council (NRC), International labor organization (ILO), United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), Mannion

Most of these organizations operate within the country and collaborate with many other national associations and civil society organizations.
